Asian Women for Equality at the 4th World Congress for the Abolition of Prostitution 1-3, June 2024 in Montreal.

CAP International's World Congress is the world's largest gathering about abolishing prostitution, bringing together a unique panel of survivors, researchers, frontline workers, activists, parliamentarians and officials.

Speaking on the panel "The Last Girl First! Prostitution at the intersection of sexist, racist and class-based oppressions", Suzanne Jay of Asian Women for Equality described how prostitution affects Asian women in Canada and identified the critical importance of women's grassroots organizing.
